Donation professionals check your state donor registry and the National Donate Life Registry at the time of your death. The most recent donor registration is honored as your legal document of gift.

## WHO CAN DONATE?

Many individuals can become eye, tissue, or organ donors regardless of their medical history. Ultimately, an individual's suitability for donation is based on many factors at the time of death, so it's important that you leave that determination up to donation professionals instead of assuming that you don't qualify.

## WHAT CAN I DONATE?

Organ donation can help save the lives of individuals waiting for a heart, lungs, kidneys, liver, intestines, or pancreas. Deceased donors can save the lives of up to 8 people through organ donation and enhance the lives of at least 75 others through tissue donation. Additionally, many tissues can be donated, including corneas, tendons, heart valves, veins, skin, and bone.

## WHAT ABOUT LIVING DONATION?

Right now, the National Donate Life Registry only acts as a documented gift record for deceased donation. However, for many waiting for a kidney or liver transplant, their gift may come from a living donor.
